## MINDFUL EXPLORERS

Mindful Explorers come into schools and nurseries and carry out a series of workshops which aim to promote mental well-being in parents and children. These workshops use multisensory play and a combination of fun mindfulness and yoga based activities.



### MUSIC THERAPY

Karen Diamond, a music therapist, will be coming into the nursery on Wednesday mornings to work with some of the children. Music Therapy is a fun way for children to develop a range of skills which equip them as they move into primary school. The skills include:

- Speech and language/communication e.g. encouraging vocal sounds
- Social skills through increased turn taking and improved listening
- Sensory development e.g. tolerance of sounds, touch and space
- Motor development e.g. movement and muscle control
  - Cognitive development, especially attention and concentration skills

On <u>Friday 18<sup>th</sup> November 2022</u> the children will be going on an Autumn walk to the Falls Park. This is a great opportunity for children to observe autumn changes in the natural environment which we have been talking about in the classroom.

### USING A KNIFE AND FORK AT DINNER TIME

In nursery all children need to be able to use a knife and fork independently at dinner time and are already pouring their own milk/water. Please encourage your child to sit at the table at meal times and to become independent with the use of a knife and fork.











### SAFETY OF THE CHILDREN

The safety of the children within our school is paramount. Punctuality is important and we ask parents to respect this. If arriving late please be patient when ringing the bell as all teachers are busy with your children and teaching has to be interrupted in order to answer the door.

# Mrs Magee's Class:

### CHILDREN WHO ARE UNWELL OR ON ANTI-BIOTICS

Children who are unwell should be kept at home especially if they have been given Calpol or Nurofen. If they are sick enough to be medicated then they are too sick for school. Please be aware that if your child has had vomiting/diarrhoea they must stay out of school for 48 hours after they have last been sick or passed a loose bowel movement. These measures are in place to stop the spread of disease amongst other children and staff. We thank you for your cooperation in this matter.
